Ordinance 4116: "Leaving Animals Unattended in Motor Vehicle"

This last summer, the City Council of Edmonds passed Ordinance 4116 which created a new provision or chapter to code 5.05 known as "Leave or confine any animal in an unattended Motor Vehicle or enclosed Space – Officers' Authority to reasonably remove Animal (5.05.128.2)".

As you know there have been issues with pets being left in hot cars during summer. Statistics show that on a 75-degree day that within 10 minutes the temperature in the car will reach 100 degrees and another 10 minutes will reach 120 degrees. On an 85-degree day, 100 is reached in seven minutes and 120 in less than 15 minutes.

In speaking with Assistant Police Chief Lawless, he stated that animal control is not going to just be patrolling the streets looking for dogs in cars. He also said that Animal Control Officers will assess the situation to see if it is really warranted such as does the dog appear to be in distress? So yes, you can still run errands with your dog just as you understand the timing of your errands and the status of the weather. He also stated that sometimes people coming up to vehicles will provoke an animal and basically, again, the Animal Control Officer, if called, will assess the situation. The Penalties are as follows:

1st Infraction: \$100; 2nd Infraction is \$250 and third and subsequent infractions: punishable as a misdemeanor.


