These custom military memorial statues are portraits of real soldiers and their K-9 partners who served with honor and distinction. The SOF K-9 memorials pay tribute to a unique breed of military dog. Ms. Toritch has created several life sized, bronze statues of military dogs including a Belgian Malinois dressed in full combat gear."

New NON-EMERGENCY Number to use!!!

From now on, don't call 911 unless it's to report an emergency. Snohomish County dispatchers have a new phone number for non-emergency calls and that number is: **425-775-3000**. The new number allows operators to reserve 911 for true emergencies, and is expected to help cut down on delays when dispatching first responders. It also aligns Snohomish County with national standards for emergency dispatch, as agencies across the U.S. are launching non-emergency numbers. If you're not sure if why you're calling is an emergency, dial 911 just in case. A dispatcher will prioritize your call for emergency response.

The same call takers answer both numbers, but they're flagged differently, so that the operator will know to route the 911 call first, followed by a non-emergency call.
