Edmonds Office Hobbs jumps into action on day off!



In 2013, O.L.A.E. donated \$2,000 to the Edmonds Police Foundation (EPF) to support obtaining a trained K-9 officer for the Edmonds Police force as K-9 Officer Dash was retiring. A trained K-9 generally cost about \$8,000 and the Foundation had been selling stuffed police dogs toys to raise money. Our donation topped off the amount the EPF needed and Edmonds Police Officer Jason Robinson soon was in training with a German Shepard that he named Hobbs.

Last month, Hobbs apprehended a suspect in Lynnwood following an armed robbery in Mountlake Terrace. A man reported that three male suspects had broken into his residence through a back window and held the victim at gunpoint and robbed him and then got away with his phone and car keys.

An Edmonds police officer reported that he saw the suspects' vehicle and saw two male suspects flee on foot. Officers set up a containment perimeter and requested Officer Hobbs was put in motion and he and his handler, Officer Jason Robinson located one of the suspects and took him into custody. The second suspect was not located, police said. The captured suspect was treated at Swedish Edmonds before being interviewed by detectives and booked into the Snohomish County Jail for robbery and burglary. **WOOF Hobbs!**
