Dogs and Heat

According to the American Kennel Club here is issues relating to the understand heatstroke. Heatstroke in dogs is life threatening and can also result in very serious complications. There are early signs of heatstroke that you can be alert to that may help you remedy the condition before things get too serious.

Early signs of heatstroke include: heavy panting and rapid breathing, excessive drooling, dry mucous membranes, bright red gums and tongue, skin hot to the touch, and a higher heart rate. Affected dogs become hyperactive and may have difficulty maintaining balance.

As exposure to excessive heat goes on, the dog's condition worsens and includes signs of shock: pale mucous membranes with white or blue gums, very rapid heart rate, and a drop in blood pressure. The dog hyperventilates, and dehydration becomes more severe. Pupils dilate, the pulse becomes more irregular, and the dog has muscle tremors; he may become lethargic and unwilling to move; urinate or defecate uncontrollably; collapse and become comatose.

Dogs at the beach will try to cool themselves with the saltwater of the Puget Sound and again, that could also be dangerous as salt water is not a good source of water. Contact your vet immediately if you see any signs.

Dogs and Fireworks

There are very few pets that like fireworks. The City of Edmonds just passed new fees for violators of the fireworks ban. So please, do not use fireworks and please call the City so that they can register the complaint so that there is a record for the Administration and City Council to review.

Doney Coe Pet Clinic

Since 1986 Doney Coe Pet Clinic has been supporting the animal-human bond by providing comprehensive no-cost veterinary care to families experiencing low income or homelessness. In the beginning, our Founder, Dr. Bud Doney, carried his supplies out into the community to meet pet owners one-on-one. His colleague, Dr. Stan Coe, carried on his vision and set up multi-service mobile clinics operating out of the Union Gospel Mission in Pioneer Square. Doney Coe now operates several clinics each month in borrowed veterinary clinic space, helping hundreds of animals. When complex or critical care is needed. patients are referred to their network of trusted partners for diagnostic and surgical procedures at no cost.

On June 1, 2022, Doney Coe Pet Clinic opened a full-service veterinary clinic at its permanent location on 3rd Avenue in downtown Seattle: but unfortunately, the lease expired at the end of April 2023 and not renewed. During 2022, Doney Coe was able to expand its services to do most surgeries with sophisticated diagnostic testing, including imaging and blood analysis. As such, they were able to see more pets per month since there is a great need for these services. Doney Coe is working to secure another permanent space. In the meantime, doctors and staff are doing what our organization has always done adapt to the circumstances and help as many pets as we can.
